

Selecting and Tracking Around Data: Duration Data

Duration Data Described: Duration data measures the amount of time between two events.



Think like this: Consider duration data as an amount of time that shows how long something lasts from start to finish.

Common Uses of Duration Data:

Duration data can show how long a student engages in a task or behavior. A few examples:

- How long a child works on a task.
- · How long a child works without being disruptive.
- How long it takes a child to complete a test.
- How long a behavior lasts.



Data (Numbers) Time - Duration data is collected showing a time when a task or behavior began, followed by a time Collected: the task or behavior ended. Compare the difference between the two times to reveal the duration.

Sample Data Form

Describe/name the student barrier: Oliver is impulsive and very distracted.

Describe the barrier's impact on the learner's ability to perform: He regularly disrupts peers and fails to complete assignments.

Describe the task or behavior: Once beginning a task, measure the sustained amount of time Oliver works without talking to a peer.

Accommodation: Seat student to reduce distractions.
